

Ministry Accomplishments (2006-2008):

- Worked with the Kenya Vision Team and the World Outreach Team at The Falls Church to help develop the vision and prepare structures for the Kenya Connection (www.kenyaconnection.org).
- Taught 70 high school students basic computer skills at Akiba School in Nairobi's Kangemi Slum (www.thefallschurch.org/akiba).
- Taught discipleship lessons to roughly 150 subsistence level farmers in various regions of Central Kenya through Planting Faith Ministries. Provided communications support for Planting Faith and helped coordinate a TFC Global Engagement Trip to assist in sustainable agricultural development in Ngarendare, Kenya. (www.plantingfaith.org).
- Helped stabilize a fledgling microenterprise in Nairobi's Kawangware Slum. Worked with Light and Power Centre to provide Christian mentorship to 12 impoverished youth and develop sustainable business practices. Future Goals and Involvement:
